PLEASE READ YOUR RESERVATION CONFIRMATION CAREFULLY & BE SURE TO REVIEW THE COUNCIL POLICY ON CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS.

1. The capacity listed for each facility is the **maximum** capacity.
2. All units must check-in with the camp ranger and have a campsite reservation. Report any damages found at check-in immediately. A unit roster must be submitted at check-in with signature of the “on site” leader.
3. All Out-of-Council Units must submit a Local Tour Permit at Check-in. All Cub Scout Units must have a BALOO trained leader in attendance.
4. Use only those areas assigned to your unit.
5. Any check written for payments of fees, damage, supplies, etc. must show name, address and phone number of person writing the check. This includes unit checks.
6. Units need to supply their own water containers, garbage bags, etc.
7. Report any accident or injury to the Camp Ranger immediately. Our camps do not carry weekend medical/accident or theft insurance. The Camp Ranger can supply emergency medical facility information. The Key leader should have a current health history for each Scout.
8. Do not climb on roofs or through the windows of any of our camp buildings or over any fences.
9. Garbage must be taken to assigned areas.
10. Units should leave a courtesy supply of firewood (enough for one full night) upon checking out.
11. All units must check out with a Camp Ranger or their designee. Additional fees for damage, propane, etc. will be collected at this time. A Scout is “Clean” and the general rule is always leave camp a little better than when you arrived. All loaned equipment must be returned in good, clean working condition.
12. The following are **not allowed** at camp for the safety and enjoyment of all campers: pets, fireworks, personal guns, rifles, bows, arrows, slingshots or other weapons, sheath knives or machetes, chainsaws, snowmobiles, dirt bikes, motorcycles, ATVs or other motorized vehicles, alcoholic beverages, drugs or controlled substances.
13. The use of all liquid fuels is prohibited. Propane appliances are permitted and must be used with caution under adult supervision. Campfires must be built in established campfire rings only. Keep fires small, never leave them unattended and be sure they are “cold out” when finished.
14. Do not cut or injure any standing tree or shrub. Do not ditch tents or dig holes for any purpose. Do not kill or abuse any wildlife.
15. Units are not allowed to use waterfront or pool facilities without expressed permission of the ranger.
16. All units must observe the 11 PM curfew.
17. Cancellations 45 days or more prior to the date scheduled receive a full refund or credit. Cancellations 21-44 days before the scheduled date receive a full credit. Cancellations within 20 days of the scheduled date receive a 50% credit. “No Shows” forfeit the full amount of the reservation fee. Credits are valid for six months and can be used for payment of weekend camping fees at any GNYC camp.
18. A \$20 processing fee is charged for all returned checks.

TIPS FOR MAKING A SUCCESSFUL SHORT TERM RESERVATION

The following are some helpful tips on making a weekend reservation.

1. Know what weekend dates you would like to go camping. Always keep alternate dates in mind as the weekend you are booking may have already been reserved. Also, know which camp and facilities you would like, i.e. cabin, tent sites or lean-tos. Please have this entire information ready before you make your call.
2. Call Early! Reservations can be made up to 12 months in advance for Greater New York Council Units and 11 months in advance for Out Of Council Units. While reservations for tent sites, lean-tos, picnics and day trips can usually be accommodated, cabin reservations for the months of October through April fillup far in advance.
3. Call the Camping Reservations Hot Line at 888-346-5805 Monday through Friday from 9^{AM} – 5^{PM}. Please be advised that the average reservation takes approximately 5-10 minutes. Please be patient as reservations sometimes takes longer than the time stated above. If all lines are unavailable, leave a detailed message including your name, telephone number, dates, camp and facilities you wish to reserve. Always speak clearly and spell your name, if necessary. Your call will be returned in the order it was received, usually the same day. If that is not possible, your call will be returned the following afternoon. Please do not leave multiple messages, this slows the process down.
4. After your dates are confirmed and the reservation is made, a confirmation copy is mailed the same day to the address you have given. Please read it carefully. It contains information regarding the date, camp facility, amount due and the council policy regarding refunds and cancellations. If you have not received your confirmation at least ten business days after your reservation was made, please call to let us know.
5. You have 15 days after the reservation is made to make your payment. If payments are not received, your reservation may be cancelled and the site given to someone else.

LEADERSHIP POLICY FOR ALL B.S.A. TRIPS AND OUTINGS!!!

Two registered adults leaders, or one adult leader and a parent of a participating Scout, one of whom must be at least 21 years of age or older, are required for all trips or outings. Co-ed overnight activities require male and female adult leadership. It is the responsibility of the chartered organization of any Pack, Troop, Post, Team, Crew or Ship to ensure the unit committee and other leadership provides sufficient leadership on all trips and outings.

The “safety rule of four” requires that no fewer than four individuals (always with the minimum of two adults) go on overnight campout. If an accident occurs, one person stays with the injured, and two go for help.

Male and female leaders require separate sleeping facilities. Married couples may share the same quarters if appropriate facilities are available.

Male and female youth participants will not share the same facility. When staying in tents, no youth will stay in the tent of an adult other than his or her parent or guardian.
